#### THE PLACE

In and near Chota, Tennessee.
Chota functioned as the capital of the Overhill Cherokee settlements and was a City of Refuge during Nanyehi's lifetime.
Ft. Loudoun (1756-1760) is near present-day Vonore, Tennessee

#### THE CHARACTERS

Nanyehi—Her given name is a reference to the immortals\*. Called "Wild Rose "as a child, later "Nancy Ward" by whites

Tenia- Nanyehi's mother, Attakullakulla's sister

Longfellow—Nanyehi's elder brother

Attakullakulla - Nanyehi's uncle, Peace Chief of the Cherokee

\*Nunnehi- To the Cherokee, a race of immortal spirit people

Dragging Canoe – Attakullakulla's son and Nanyehi's cousin; he was later to become War Chief of the Chickamauga

Oconastota -War chief of the Overhill Cherokees

Kingfisher- Nanyehi's first husband

Katie (Kai ti)- Nanyehi's first child, daughter of Nanyehi and Kingfisher

Fivekiller –son of Nanyehi and Kingfisher, called "Littlefellow" in childhood

Bryant Ward -- Nanyehi's second husband

Betsy – Nanyehi's third child, daughter of Bryant Ward

Sequina, Sali, Tooka—Nanyehi's best friends

Isaac Thomas—An American at Ft. Loudoun.

Lydia Bean and Virginia, white settlers at Ft. Loudoun

South Carolina Governor William Lyttleton

John Moreland—white settler

Col. Arthur Campbell—an Agent

William Peyton—white settler

Thomas Jefferson

Soldiers: American and British

Warriors: Cherokee, Creek, and Chickasaw

#### THE DIRECTORS

BILL SALAMON- (DIRECTOR) This marks the 50<sup>th</sup> year that Bill has been working in the Theatre. His credits are extensive in directing and acting and include over 150 productions in over 25 theatres throughout the North Texas area. On staff at the Texan, he directs and works all aspects of the stage. The resonant voice of the White Wolf is Bill's.

DEDE OXLEY- (CO-DIRECTOR) DeDe thanks her longtime friend Bill Salamon for giving her the opportunity to work creatively to help translate the beautiful native symbols in Becky Hobbs's powerful story to this production. Working on masks, costumes, and set decoration, DeDe considers working with this talented group to be a joy!

### THE MUSICIANS BECKY HOBBS

#### COMPOSER/PLAYWRIGHT/ MUSIC DIRECTOR

Becky (Pianist) was born and raised in Bartlesville, OK. Becky is a 5<sup>th</sup>-great granddaughter of Nancy Ward (Nanyehi) and a Cherokee Nation citizen. Her songs have been recorded by Alabama (including "Angels Among Us"), Conway Twitty, George Jones, Loretta Lynn, Glen Campbell, Emmylou Harris, Helen Reddy, Shirley Bassey, Wanda Jackson, Janie Fricke, Moe Bandy, Moe and Joe, Lacy J. Dalton, Shelly West, Ken Mellons, the Cherokee National Youth Choir and more. As a recording artist, she's had over 20 Billboard chart singles, including "Jones on the Jukebox," "Honky Tonk Saturday Night," and Top Ten Duet with Moe Bandy, "Let's Get Over Them Together." The "Beckaroo" has performed in over 40 countries and lives in Nashville, TN with husband Duane Sciacqua. She was inducted into the Oklahoma Music Hall of Fame on Oct.16, 2015.

#### **DUANE SCIACQUA**

#### MUSICAL CONDUCTOR/ARRANGER

Duane (Acoustic, Electric & Synthesized guitars) hails from Madera, CA, playing professionally since 8th grade. For 16 years in Los Angeles, he played and recorded in bands and with artists including Glenn Frey, Joe Walsh (The Eagles), and Paul McCartney. He moved to Nashville in the 90's, and worked with Vince Gill, Gary Morris, Rodney Atkins and others. His playing is featured on television and motion picture soundtracks including *Airwolf*, *Hotshots, Cobra, Navy Seals, Stone Cold* and *Hardball*. He produced and recorded the soundtrack for *Nanyehi*, and owns and operates Rough Edges Recording Studio. He writes, produces and works as a session guitarist.

BRANDON MAAHS (GUITAR & MANDOLIN) plays trumpet, guitar and is a composer from Denton, TX. He's performed in and conducted several musicals, currently finishing his BA in journalism at UNT, he plans to attend NYU.

REBECCA VILLAREAL (KEYBOARD) is a percussionist, pianist, and educator from Denton, TX. She is a senior at UNT, earning a BA in Music Education. She will begin work on her Master's of Music in Percussion Performance at the Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music in the fall of 2016.

CONNOR PICKLE (DRUMS & PERCUSSION) is a professional musician and educator living in the Dallas/Ft. Worth Metroplex. He is the Director of Percussion Studies for Melissa ISD in Melissa, TX. He performs and records with musical acts and gives clinics throughout the country.

KIRK POWERS (BASS) A native of New York City, Kirk has toured with Debbie Gibson and performed on television productions including *The Wonder Years*, American Music Awards and Arsenio Hall. He lives near Austin, TX and is an animal and dog advocate in his free time.

#### **CHOREOGRAPHY**

NICOLE WEEKLEY- (NATIVE CHOREOGRAPHY/ NUNNEHI/WHITE WOLF DANCER) As a child, Nicole was a television actress in Hollywood, doing commercials and movies. Onstage now as an adult, she brings American Tribal Style and Tribal fusion dancing into the Native choreography for this show, as well as creative costume and prop designs.

HAILEY MUSGROVE- (BALLET CHOREOGRAPHY/ NUNNEHI) Veteran dancer/performer Hailey has made a Medieval Times commercial, among others, soloed at Follies, and danced in *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum* last fall.

#### STUNTS

ROB STUCKER- (STUNT AND MARTIAL ARTS CHOREOGRAPHY) Owner of the ChopShop in downtown Greenville, Rob is an instructor in Mixed Martial Arts, choreographing the stunts for this production. His sons Devon and Seth and his students lend great energy to this show.

#### THE CAST

BRITNIE ROSENBALM- (NANYEHI) is making her dramatic debut in *Nanyehi*, *The Story of Nancy Ward*. She is often seen at area events, singing with her mom, Renee Francey. Britnie wants specially to thank her husband, children, family, and friends for their support. Britnie works for Hunt County Radio in Greenville.

DAVID SUMRALL- (DRAGGING CANOE, CHORUS) Gospel - singing David owns Texas Deck Company, and also worked on the Texan Theater during its remodeling. "I'd like to thank my wife Cindy for loving me, and of course, for permission. Thank you, Donna, for feeding us late after practices, and Lacy and Bradley for putting up with us and our crazy haircuts!"

EMMY BEAN- (TENIA, CHORUS) is surprised to find herself in the production of *Nanyehi*, as she had no previous experience onstage. The adventure has been both educational and satisfying, and she thanks her husband and daughters for supporting her in this journey a long way out of her comfort zone.

JADE FAITH SEIGLER- (SEQUINA) Outgoing eighth-grader Jade credits Mrs. Kathleen Smith for introducing her to theater and acting. She says, "Fly high, Mrs. Smith!" and thanks the cast, crew and directors for their help.

MONTE MONKRESS- (ATTAKULLAKULLA) This is Monte's first appearance at the Texan Theater, but he has a long list of dramatic and comedic credits in Dallas area productions. He lives in Rockwall with his wife Denise.

DALTON WILLIS- (BRYANT WARD/CHORUS) Appearing for the first time onstage, Dalton is playing the Irish Tradesman with self-taught accent and dance. Dalton is a leader in Boy Scouts, and a musician.

WES HABLUETZEL- (OCONOSTOTA/CHORUS) Wes has long been involved in Greenville Follies and community theatre in Greenville He was Miles Gloriosus in A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum last fall.

JENIFFER CAMPBELL- (SALI) has always loved singing and dancing, but this is her first experience in Community Theater. She feels thankful and blessed for her husband's support. Jeniffer thanks our directors for this opportunity!

LYNN HUGHES (TOOKA) is making her musical play debut in Nanyehi. She enjoys dancing, singing, and loves traveling to see the beauty of the world. Lynn is thankful for the challenge of appearing in *Nanyehi*.


