As a recording artist, she's had over 20 charted records, including "Jones on the Jukebox" and the Top Ten Duet with Moe Bandy, "Let's Get Over Them Together." The "Beckaroo" has performed in over 40 countries and lives in Nashville, TN. She is thrilled to work with Savannah River Productions and that the World Premiere of "Nanyehi" is in Hartwell, GA, where the Cherokee considered "The Center of the World."

Nick Sweet (Co-Playwright and Director)Nick Sweet has been a free-lance stage director since 1977 and has directed 130 productions for theatre groups in Oklahoma, Texas and Alaska. In 2002 he directed the historical outdoor drama, Trail of Tears, at the Cherokee Heritage Center in Tahleguah, Okla.
